# TRAVEL TIPS

With over four million miles of highway, the USA offers more road trips than anyone could tackle in one lifetime. From wide open highways to country back roads, driving around and across the USA is easy. Here are some basic rules to follow before you take the wheel.

## DRIVING TIPS

- All cars are left hand drive but remember to drive on the right side of the road!
- Learn the local road rules!
  - › Speed limit signs are in miles per hour
  - › Generally, regional speed limits will not exceed 70 miles - per hour (110 kilometres)
  - › You can turn right on a red light after coming to a complete stop
  - › The first car to arrive at an all-way stop has right of way
  - › It's illegal to pass a school bus when its lights are flashing red
- Fuel is sold by the gallon and is known as gasoline. Often international credit cards don't work at the payment machines at the petrol pump so you'll need to pay inside the gas station.
- The USA has millions of miles of highways and byways, with many roadways and bridges having tolls. The method of payment for these fees vary by system and can be paid by cash, credit card or electronic pass. Many rental companies offer electronic passes.
- Look out for wildlife on and near the roads, particularly at dawn and dusk. Follow the speed limits and scan the road as you drive, watching the edges for wildlife about to cross.

## CAR HIRE TIPS

- To hire a car you will need to have an Open, valid driver's licence and must be at least 21 years old. A surcharge applies for drivers 21 to 25 years of age.
- Car hire is based on a 24 hour rental period (e.g. pick up 9am the first day; drop off 9am the next day). Any time over the 24 hour period will incur an extra charge.
- You are required to leave a cash or credit card deposit to cover the estimated extra charges not included in the car rental cost.
- Car hire generally includes unlimited mileage, loss damage waiver, state tax, third party liability, state imposed surcharges and airport contract fees.
- Make sure you budget for parking, fuel and tolls along the way.

## NATIONAL PARK FEES

A National Park fee applies to all visitors entering most national parks throughout the USA. National parks have their own entrance fees, but a US Park Pass can be purchased to cover entry to multiple parks. National Park Fees are not included in the prices featured on individual itineraries. Park passes can be purchased online at [usparkpass.com](http://usparkpass.com)

# ICONIC ROAD TRIPS

When it comes to an iconic road trip, the USA offers up some of the best. From the famous Route 66 to the scenic Pacific Coast Highway, you'll be inspired by the diverse destinations and experiences on these incredible driving routes.



Blue Ridge Parkway

## BLUE RIDGE PARKWAY

Experience 'America's Favorite Drive', the Blue Ridge Parkway. The 574 mile route curves through the Blue Ridge Mountains from Virginia to North Carolina, connecting two national parks (Shenandoah and The Great Smoky Mountains). Be prepared for breathtaking views and, of course, there are exits along the way to take in the art and culture of the Appalachian and Smoky Mountains. Admire the colourful foliage in the fall or travel in summer or spring for great hiking opportunities. With a speed limit that never exceeds 45mph and free from commercial traffic, the Blue Ridge Parkway is designed for slow pace travel.

## PACIFIC COAST HIGHWAY

Arguably one of the most famous drives in the world, don't miss the chance to cruise along California's Pacific Coast Highway from San Francisco to San Diego. This cliff-hugging route, spanning 583 miles, is meant to be traversed slowly. Journey along dramatic coastal bluffs overlooking the sparkling Pacific with its endless golden beaches. There are plenty of Insta-worthy attractions like the iconic Bixby Bridge and ancient Redwood forests along the Big Sur coastline and Hearst Castle in San Simeon. Stop in at one (or all) of the vibrant coastal Californian beach towns, think Monterey, Venice Beach and Newport Beach – to name a few!

## HISTORIC ROUTE 66

Get your kicks on Route 66, travelling along one of the world's legendary highways. A journey across Route 66 spans three time zones and runs through the heart of the country, starting in Chicago and ending at Santa Monica Pier in Los Angeles. Drive through small-town America and traverse unique landscapes, enjoying pit stops at places like Seligman, Arizona – an iconic Route 66 town filled with nostalgic treasures such as classic cars and retro neon signs. Route 66 covers eight states and passes through some of the country's most beautiful scenery including the Painted Desert, the Petrified Forest and the Grand Canyon. 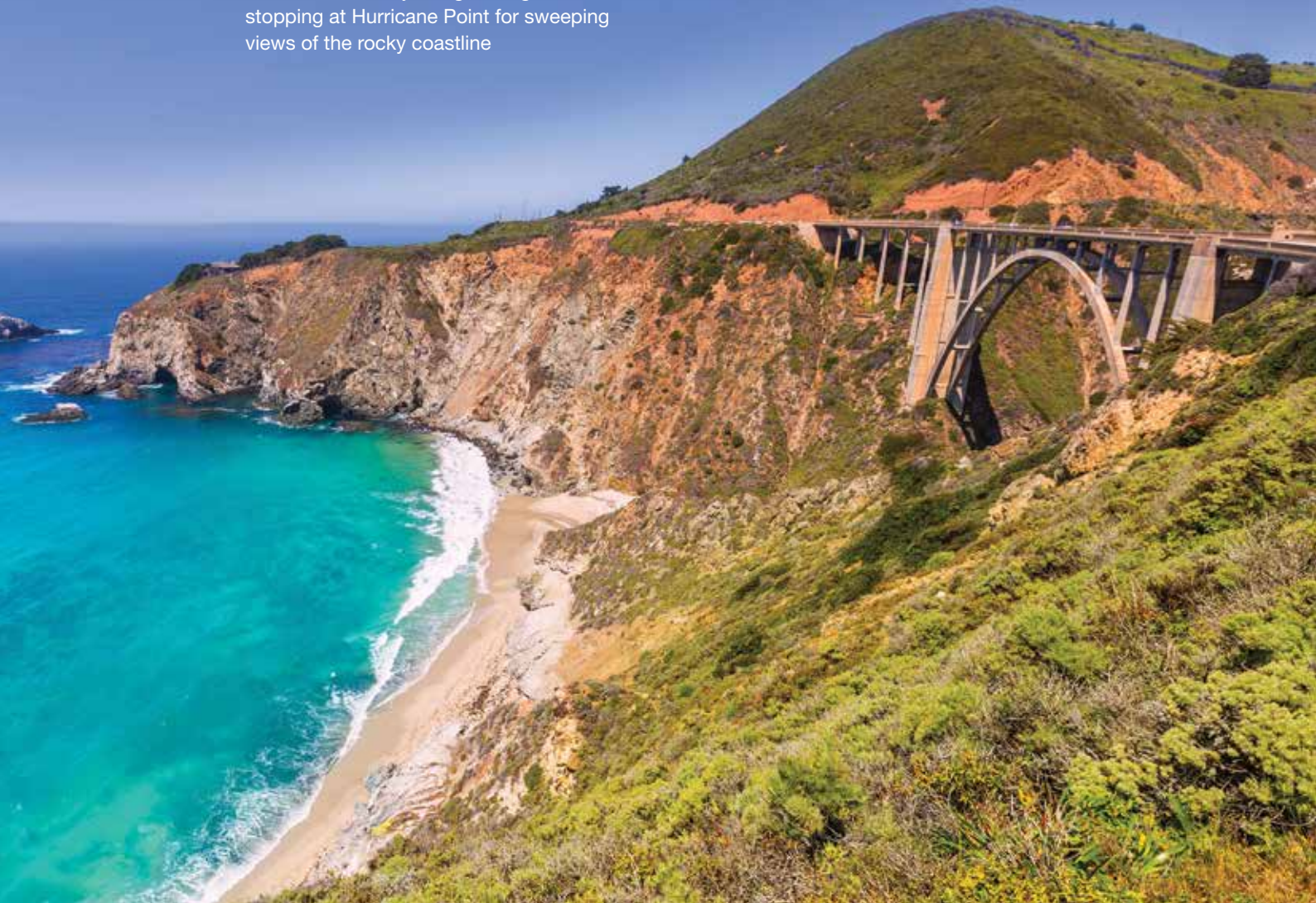

## GIANT TREES & ANCIENT FORESTS 6 DAYS

Take in the unique natural beauty of USA's national parks and picturesque lakes in California.

### Day 1: San Francisco

Upon arrival in San Francisco pick up your rental vehicle and drive to your hotel. Then, as you explore the city, take the time to visit San Francisco's most iconic landmarks. Be sure to taste the city's famous clam chowder at one of the many seafood restaurants at Fisherman's Wharf and see the well known sea lions on PIER 39. Climb up Telegraph Hill to take in panoramic city views from the top of Coit Tower, stroll down winding Lombard Street and don't forget to walk or cycle along the Golden Gate Bridge. Alternatively, venture outside of the city to Muir Woods National Monument. See coastal towering Redwoods that are 600 to 800 years old and stand 76 metres tall. Overnight in San Francisco.

### Day 2: San Francisco to Lassen Volcanic National Park – 379km

Leave San Francisco and travel through Northern California to Lassen Volcanic National Park and admire the mighty Lassen Peak. Take a moment to see boiling springs, steaming sulfur vents and bubbling mud pots. Hike through the Devastated Area and view remnants of past eruptions. Be sure to walk among the lush forests and around crystal clear lakes. Overnight near Lassen Volcanic National Park.

### Day 3: Lassen Volcanic National Park to Lake Tahoe – 297km

Follow the Pacific Crest National Scenic Trail to Lake Tahoe, through Lassen Volcanic National Park. Take the time to enjoy the many lake activities, hike or bike the trails, or simply enjoy the breathtaking scenery. Overnight in Lake Tahoe.

### Day 4: Lake Tahoe to Yosemite National Park – 199km

Travel through the High Sierra Nevada mountains to reach Yosemite National Park. Marvel at the stunning landmarks of this beautiful national park including Bridalveil Fall, and the granite cliffs of Half Dome and El Capitan. Don't miss out on visiting the Ansel Adams Gallery of landscape photography and the Yosemite Museum. Overnight near Yosemite National Park.

### Day 5: Yosemite National Park to San Francisco – 288km

Arrive back in San Francisco and discover more of what this world-class city has to offer. A ferry trip to Alcatraz in San Francisco Bay is not to be missed (extra charge). Alternatively, visit Presidio of San Francisco, a former U.S. Army military fort that is now a park in the Golden Gate Recreation Area. Overnight in San Francisco.

### Day 6: San Francisco

**GEOLOGICAL WONDERS 6 DAYS**

Travel to awesome natural wonders, visit ancient sites and be inspired by captivating landscapes.

**Day 1: Salt Lake City**

On arrival into Salt Lake City, pick up your rental vehicle and proceed to your hotel. A visit to the city is not complete without seeing Temple Square and its renowned architecture. Perhaps take a trolley tour of the four hectare square and other major attractions (extra charge). Be sure to stroll through the botanical gardens and arboretum at Red Butte Garden. Explore Wasatch National Forest, or venture to the high-speed bobsled ride at Utah Olympic Park. Overnight in Salt Lake City.

**Day 2: Salt Lake City to Jackson Hole – 482km**

Depart Salt Lake City and travel north to Grand Teton National Park, located in northwest Wyoming. The park is home to the Teton Range, Grand Teton Peak and the valley known as Jackson Hole. While there, take in the clear blue skies and see the large array of wildlife as you hike or bike some of the many trails. Overnight in Jackson Hole.

**Day 3: Jackson Hole to Yellowstone National Park – 112km**

Today drive along the John D. Rockefeller Memorial Highway as you make your way to Yellowstone National Park. Discover the USA's first national park which sits atop a volcanic hot spot

that creates impressive geothermal activity. Don't miss out on viewing Old Faithful and other natural wonders, such as hot springs, geysers and pools. Be on the look out for wolves, elk, bison, bears and moose in their natural habitat. Perhaps explore the park by hiking or biking the many backcountry trails. Overnight near Yellowstone National Park.

**Day 4: Yellowstone National Park to Twin Falls – 508km**

Venture into Idaho to the Craters of the Moon National Monument and Preserve in the Snake River Plain, a volcanic wonderland full of enormous lava flows. Visit the Hagerman Fossil Beds National Monument, located just outside Twin Falls. See prehistoric horse fossils as well as many other animals such as mastodon, sabre-toothed cats and bears. Overnight in Twin Falls.

**Day 5: Twin Falls to Salt Lake City – 352km**

Depart Twin Falls and head back to Salt Lake City. On your way, stop by the Gold Spike National Historic Site, dedicated to the important completion of the first Trans Continental Railroad. Then return to Salt Lake City to explore more of what the city has to offer. Overnight in Salt Lake City.

**Day 6: Salt Lake City**

## CANYON ADVENTURE 8 DAYS

Discover some of the most unique landscapes in the USA from massive red-rock formations to one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World.

### Day 1: Las Vegas

Arrive in Las Vegas and make your way to the hotel. Enjoy the rest of the day experiencing the excitement of Las Vegas, the 'Entertainment Capital of the World'. Spend the next two nights in Las Vegas.

### Day 2: Las Vegas

Today you have free time to explore Las Vegas at your leisure. Don't miss out on trying your luck at one of the many casinos, see a world-class show, stroll along the famed Las Vegas Strip and stop by at the iconic 'Welcome to Las Vegas' sign for an Insta-worthy photo.

### Day 5: Moab to Mesa Verde National Park – 229km

Today enjoy a full day exploring some of the country's most unique landscapes. On your way to Mesa Verde National Park, stop at awe-inspiring Canyonlands National Park. Admire this stunning scenery which took over 300 million years to form. Upon reaching Mesa Verde National Park, see some of the world's best preserved Native American cliff dwellings. Overnight in Mesa Verde National Park.

### Day 6: Mesa Verde National Park to Grand Canyon – 498km

This morning head to iconic Monument Valley to view red sandstone spires and monoliths. Don't miss out on visiting the trading post of Cameron and travel through the Navajo Indian Reservation, before arriving at the breathtaking Grand Canyon. Overnight in the Grand Canyon.

### Day 7: Grand Canyon to Las Vegas – 450km

Enjoy the day at leisure exploring one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World. Take the time to marvel at plunging gorges and towering spires formed by the Colorado River. Perhaps take a scenic flight to see the vastness of the canyon (extra charge). Depart the Grand Canyon and visit the impressive Hoover Dam, before arriving in Las Vegas. Overnight in Las Vegas.

### Day 8: Las Vegas

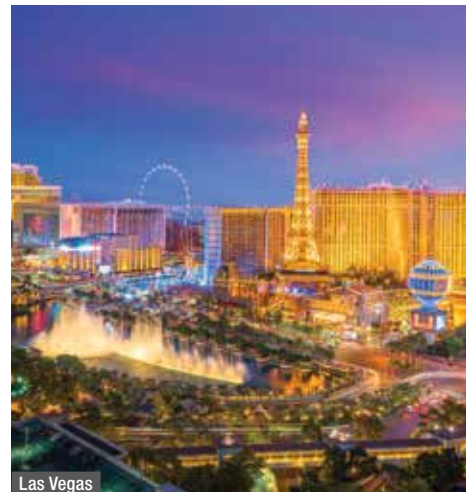

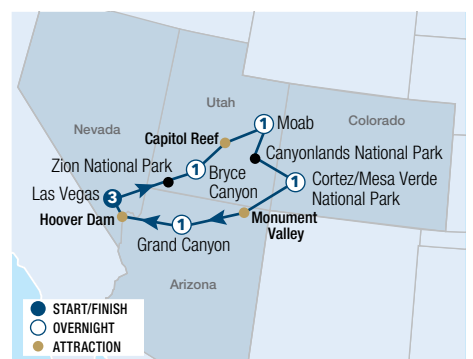

## POSTCARDS OF CALIFORNIA 8 DAYS

Take the ultimate California road trip as you follow the stunning coast through seaside towns and iconic national parks.

### Day 1: Los Angeles

Arrive in sunny Los Angeles and pick up your vehicle to begin exploring the city. Take the time to visit world-famous beaches such as Santa Monica and Venice, head to the Hollywood Walk of Fame and stroll along Rodeo Drive. Overnight in Los Angeles.

### Day 2: Los Angeles to California's Central Coast – 296km

through California Gold Country, before arriving into Yosemite National Park. Spend the next two nights in the Yosemite National Park area.

### Day 5: Yosemite National Park

Enjoy the day exploring Yosemite National Park. Admire some of the world's most spectacular scenery including waterfalls, forests and groves of giant sequoias. Be inspired by the sheer granite domes and cliffs that soar thousands of metres up from the valley floor. The massive glacial-shaped rock formations of El Capitan and Half Dome sure to impress.

### Day 6: Yosemite National Park to San Francisco – 269km

Depart Yosemite National Park and continue to the 'City on the Bay', San Francisco. Stretch your legs at the Knights Ferry Recreation Area, a beautiful park offering many hiking trails and excellent picnic areas. Spend the next two nights in San Francisco.

### Day 7: San Francisco

Spend the day at leisure exploring San Francisco and the many world-class attractions on offer. Visit Fisherman's Wharf to see the famous sea lions at PIER 39, dine at one of the many seafood restaurants or take a ferry across to Alcatraz (extra charge).

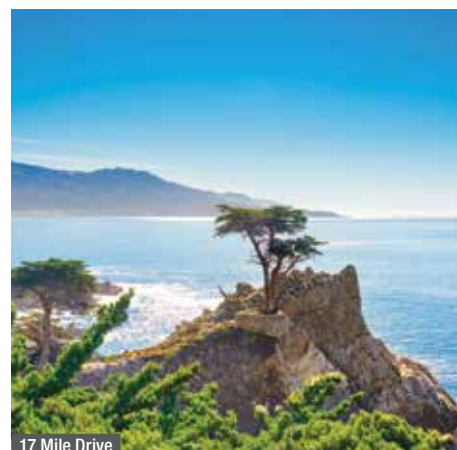

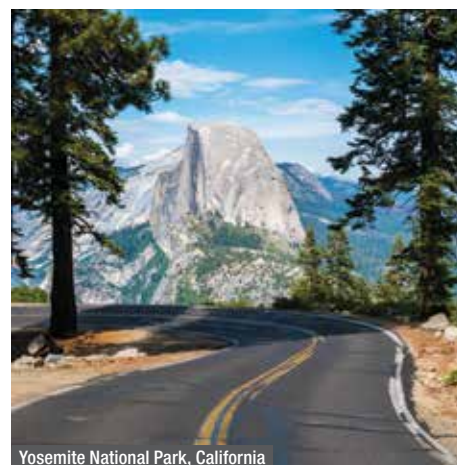

## PACIFIC COAST EXPLORER 11 DAYS

From the picturesque coastline and pristine lakes to world-class wineries and majestic mountains, the Pacific Coast is waiting to be explored.

### Day 1: Seattle

Upon arrival in Seattle pick up your rental vehicle and make your way to your hotel. Spend the afternoon exploring the city. Visit the iconic Space Needle observation tower or take in the many colourful exhibits at the Museum of Pop Culture (extra charge). This evening, explore Seattle's rich culinary scene. Overnight in Seattle.

### Day 2: Seattle via Mount Rainier National Park to Portland – 430km

Depart this morning for Portland, Oregon's largest city. En route, visit Mount Rainier National Park and Mount St. Helens, both active volcanoes and part of the Northwest 'ring of fire'. Cross the Columbia River and admire the stunning mountain views. Overnight in Portland.

### Day 3: Portland to Redwood National Park – 560km

Today, drive along the dramatic coastline of Oregon. Take a moment to admire the breathtaking views and stop at Coos Bay and stroll along the white sandy beach or admire the spectacular waterfalls. ### Day 1: San Francisco to Napa Valley – 145km

of the surrounding valley and mountains from the outdoor terrace, while enjoying a glass of Pinot Noir or Chardonnay. Then venture north to Paschal Winery, with its hilltop tasting room overlooking pear orchards and the local mountain ranges. Spend the next two nights in the Rogue Valley.

### Day 7: Rogue Valley

Today explore the picturesque Rogue Valley. Visit Del Rio Vineyard Estate, then head back to Grants Pass for wine tasting and lunch at the Schmidt Family Vineyards. 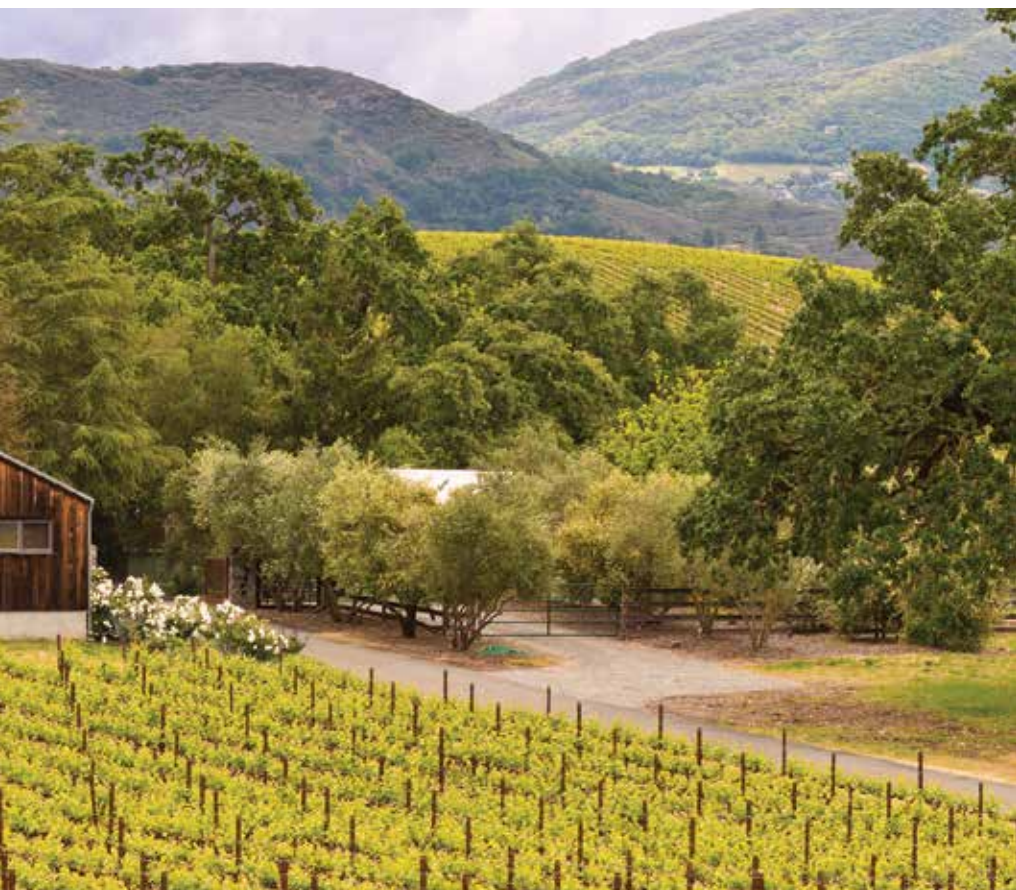

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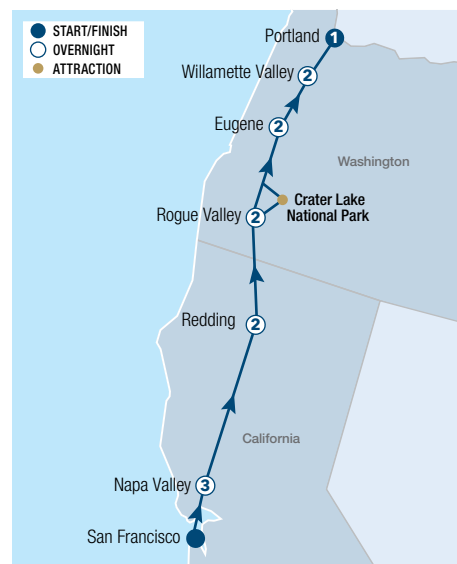

### Days 1-2: Seattle

### Days 8-9: Coos Bay to San Francisco – 967km

Arrive in San Francisco and bask in the history of this city, which was the heart of the 1960s hippie sub-culture. Spend time at Haight & Ashbury, where The Grateful Dead lived, then walk to Buena Vista Park to gaze down at the colourful Victorian homes. Mix history with current music by catching today's big names at The Fillmore, an historic music venue that once drew legends like Janis Joplin, the Rolling Stones and Prince. Music

### Day 1: Dallas

Pick up your rental vehicle in Dallas and check in to your hotel. Experience this major Texan city with its classic barbecue, cowboy boots and country music. Stop at the Oklahoma Route 66 Museum in Clinton to see exhibits depicting the history and legends of the most famous highway in the USA. Cross the state border back into Texas, en route to Amarillo. See several vintage 'Mother Road' icons, as well as glimpses of the Wild West. Long stretches of the old road remain, with the original concrete in many spots. Overnight in Amarillo.

### Day 4: Amarillo to Santa Fe – 374km

Drive west along Route 66 to Adrian, Texas and make a stop at the Midpoint Café. This is the half way point of Route 66, between Chicago and Los Angeles. Cross into New Mexico, stop at Tucumcari to see one of the last remaining curio shops in the state, before arriving in Santa Fe. Admire the scenery as it changes into desert with mountains and mesas. Spend the next two nights in Santa Fe.

### Day 5: Santa Fe

Enjoy a full day at leisure in Santa Fe. Visit the famous Canyon Road galleries, shops and restaurants. See colourful artwork at the Georgia O'Keefe Museum, before lunch at one of the many restaurants serving famous New Mexican chilli peppers. Learn about the Puebloan people at Bandelier National Monument.

### Day 6: Santa Fe to Carlsbad – 482km

Head south to Carlsbad. Stop at Roswell, the site of the 1947 Roswell Incident and visit the UFO Museum. Continue to Carlsbad Caverns National Park with its rocky slopes and deep canyons of the Guadalupe Mountain range. Hike along the steep two kilometre trail, to explore the underground caves. Overnight in Carlsbad.

### Day 7: Carlsbad to Fredericksburg – 643km

This morning venture into Texas Hill Country to Fredericksburg. Take a walking tour to explore the area's German heritage (extra charge). Afterwards, sample local culinary favourites at the town's bistros, bakeries and beer gardens. Hill Country also has a tasty barbecue tradition, so be sure to dine on signature barbecue at one of the many popular restaurants. Overnight in Fredericksburg.

### Day 8: Fredericksburg to San Antonio – 136km

Drive scenic Highway 16 from Fredericksburg to Kerrville, the unofficial capital of Texas Hill Country, before arriving in San Antonio. Explore the city's 18th century Spanish Catholic missions, including the UNESCO World Heritage Site, The Alamo. Stroll along the River Walk and sample Tex Mex dishes at one of the local restaurants. 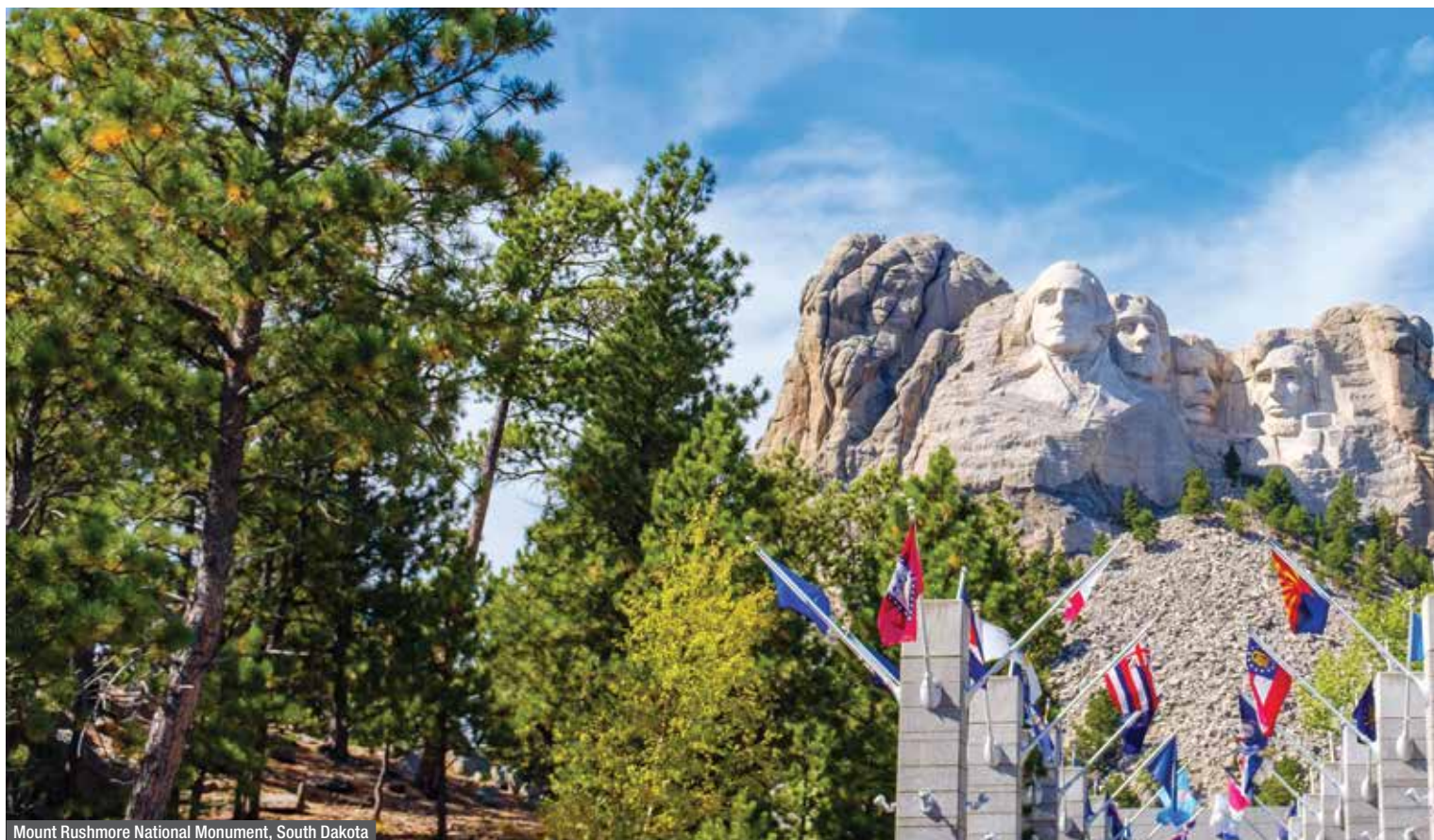

### Day 1: Denver

### Day 4: Vail to Grand Junction – 240km

Drive an hour west to scenic Glenwood Springs, known for its hot springs and caves. Take a thrilling whitewater-rafting ride on the Colorado and Roaring Fork Rivers (extra charge). Stretch your legs with a hike into the mountains and canyons, to see elk and mule deer or view the ancient petroglyphs at McKee Springs. Continue northwest to Flaming Gorge National Recreation Area, for spectacular views of the crystal reservoir and red rocks, before arriving at the historic mining town of Rock Springs. Take the time to visit the Bureau of Land Management, wild horse viewing area. Overnight in Rock Springs.

### Days 6-7: Rock Springs to Yellowstone National Park – 415km

Travel north to Jackson Hole Valley and stop for lunch in the small town of Jackson. Journey through Grand Teton National Park to Yellowstone National Park along the John D. Rockefeller Memorial Highway. A visit to Yellowstone National Park, the USA's first national park, is not to be missed. Take a full day to explore the wonders of this park. Perhaps enjoy a picnic lunch while you wait for the next eruption of Old Faithful. Be sure to visit the historic Old Faithful Inn, built in 1904. Walk along the many trails to see other natural wonders including hot springs, geysers, pools and the abundant wildlife. Spend the next two nights in Yellowstone National Park.

### Day 8: Yellowstone National Park to Billings – 323km

Head north out of Yellowstone through Gardiner towards the eclectic railroad town of Livingston. Follow the Yellowstone River Valley east to Billings, Montana. Discover the many museums that portray the history and culture of the Old West. Do not miss the chance to experience the excitement of a rodeo. Overnight in Billings.

### Day 9: Billings to Medora – 452km

Today take a slight detour with a visit to the Little Bighorn Battlefield National Monument, site of the famous 1876 battle. Journey northeast into North Dakota to the Theodore Roosevelt National Park. Make sure you take the Scenic Loop Drive to experience the Northern Great Plains and the Badlands. Overnight in Medora.





## Day 10: Medora to Rapid City – 385km

Drive east to the Painted Canyon Visitors Center. Take in spectacular views of the Badlands from the scenic overlook, before travelling into South Dakota. Head to the historic mining town of Deadwood, site of one of the Old West's most famous gold rushes. Be sure to stop at Mount Moriah Cemetery, the final resting place of Calamity Jane and Wild Bill Hickok. Travel through the stunning scenery of the Black Hills to Sturgis, before arriving into Rapid City. Take the time to visit Main Street Square, view life-size bronze statues of past US Presidents and explore the many galleries, museums and restaurants. Overnight in Rapid City.

Make sure you depart early for Keystone to see the sun rising over Mount Rushmore National Memorial. Admire the hand-carved monument, jutting from the granite of the Black Hills of South Dakota. See the faces of US Presidents George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Abraham Lincoln and Theodore Roosevelt. Then journey to another South Dakota wonder, Crazy Horse Memorial, a mountain monument under construction of the famed Lakota leader. Travel to Custer State Park, famous for its buffalo herds and scenic drives. A stop at Evans Plunge Mineral Springs in Hot Springs, is the perfect place to unwind after a day of sightseeing. Be sure to visit the Mammoth Site, an ancient sinkhole, where the fossilised remains of more than 61 mammoths have been discovered. Overnight in Hot Springs.

## Day 12: Hot Springs to Scotts Bluff – 234km

Travel south to Nebraska and stop at Chadron to tour the Museum of the Fur Trade at the James Bordeaux Trading Post, then continue to Fort Robinson State Park. At Scotts Bluff National Monument, make sure to walk on parts of the original Oregon Trail. Take the time to drive to the summit of the bluff for breathtaking valley views of the North Platte River. Overnight in Scotts Bluff.

## Day 13: Scotts Bluff to Estes Park – 303km

Depart Scotts Bluff and travel southwest to Cheyenne, Wyoming's capital. Don't miss visiting the Cheyenne Depot, a 19th century railroad station. Then head downtown for a walking tour (extra charge), before arriving at Estes Park, the 'Gateway to the Rocky Mountain National Park'. Overnight in Estes Park.

## Day 14: Estes Park to Denver – 103km

Enter the Rocky Mountain National Park and take the time to explore this truly remarkable wilderness. During summer, take the Trail Ridge Road to see spectacular views of Sundance Mountain and Tombstone Ridge. Continue to Grand Lake for lunch, then journey along the shores of Lake Granby. Travel to the beautiful Winter Park Resort and be sure to hike trails through meadows bursting with flowers, before returning to Denver in the evening. Spend the next two nights in Denver.

## Day 15: Denver

### Day 1: Chicago

En route to joining the Natchez Trace Parkway, stop in Indianola to visit the B.B. King Museum. Continue to Natchez, travelling past bygone plantations and restored antebellum mansions. Overnight in Natchez.

### Day 8: Natchez to New Orleans – 283km

Leave Natchez and stop in Baton Rouge to discover Louisiana's capital, culture and cuisine. Upon reaching New Orleans, stroll through the historic French Quarter or take a tour of cemeteries, voodoo and ghost lore. Listening to great jazz at Preservation Hall is a must-do while in New Orleans. Overnight in New Orleans.

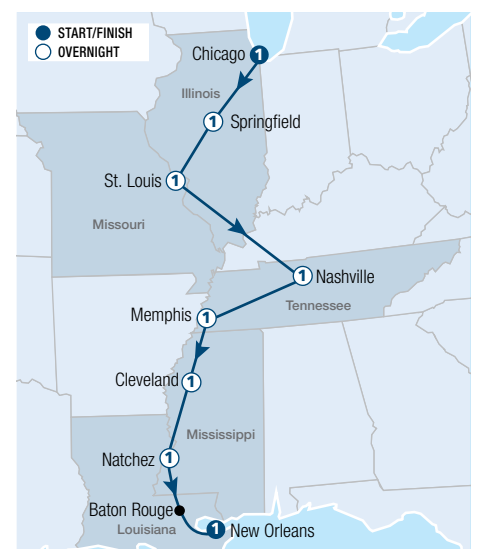

Drive along the Gulf of Mexico coastline and stop in Port Arthur to visit the Museum of the Gulf Coast, home to a hall of fame that includes Janis Joplin, Clarence 'Gatemouth' Brown, ZZ Top, Edgar and Johnny Winter. Continue to Lafayette, a vibrant south central Louisiana city. See bands playing Cajun tunes and zydeco music at local venues. Arrive in New Orleans, where musical roots run deep. You're likely to hear everything from jazz and Afro-Cuban to Dixieland, rhythm and blues and zydeco. Visit Preservation Hall to see fabulous musicians play traditional New Orleans jazz. Stop by Frenchmen Street, a hub for live music, lined with popular venues including The Spotted Cat Music Club. Discover New Orleans vibrant cuisine and cocktail culture. For an authentic experience, visit one of the last juke joints in existence, Gip's Place. Overnight in Birmingham.

### Day 10: Birmingham to Chattanooga – 267km

Before leaving Birmingham stop by the Art Deco building housing the Alabama Jazz Hall of Fame. Inside you can see the Carver Theatre where many of the greats have performed. Enjoy a jazz music history tour of legends such as Nat King Cole, Lionel Hampton and Duke Ellington. Drive two hours north to Chattanooga, where Bessie Smith was born and Usher was raised. Take the time to stop at the Songbirds Guitar Museum. Overnight in Chattanooga.

### Days 11-12: Chattanooga to Gatlinburg – 246km

Travel to Gatlinburg, famous for the Smoky Mountain Songwriter's Festival, a 10 day event held each summer. Visit the distilleries and listen to live music while sipping spirits. Visit the Dollywood theme park in Pigeon Forge. Spend the next two nights in Gatlinburg.

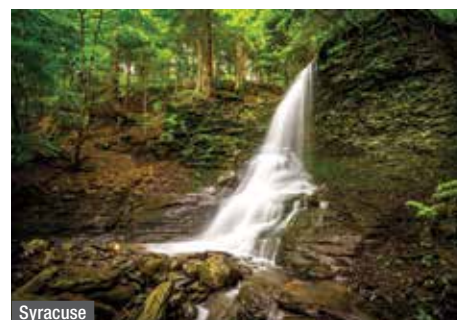

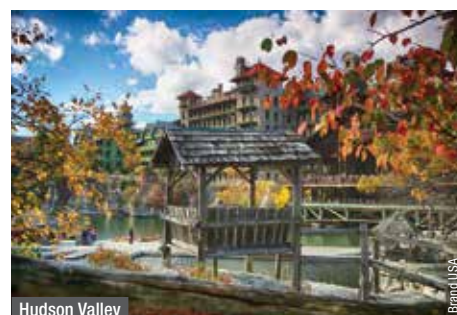

### Day 1: Chicago
